



NORTH SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT ANNUAL WATER SYSTEM FREE CHLORINE MAINTENANCE

Monday, July 13, 2026 - Monday, July 27, 2026.

Ensuring the safety and compliance of the North Springs Improvement District drinking water with all State and Federal water quality requirements is of utmost importance. To meet these standards, the District implements annual mandated preventive measures using free chlorine as the primary disinfectant. This disinfectant is safe, has no adverse health effects, and is approved by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) to provide high-quality drinking water.

This year, the Water System Free Chlorine Burn Maintenance Program will begin on Monday, July 13, 2026, and continue through Monday, July 27, 2026.

During this maintenance, customers may notice the following:

- A slight taste or chlorine odor changes in their tap water
- Fire hydrants flushed
- Flowing water in the street and swales
- Lower water pressures

If you notice flushing activities in your immediate area, please refrain from using laundry machines until activities have ceased; such rapid flushing activities may temporarily result in yellow laundry.

During this maintenance, the following precautions should be taken:

- Customers with special needs should be aware of potential problems with their equipment and systems (e.g., kidney dialysis machines).
- Aquariums and holding tank owners for fish and shellfish should be aware that this disinfection process may harm aquatic life if not adequately addressed. Seek professional advice, as the method of removing free chlorine residuals differs from removing chloramine residuals from tap water.
- Customers with inline filters may want to contact the manufacturer for any precautions.
